Burton Night Skies

Welcome to the summer edition of "Night Skies over Burton". For nerdy observers of the nighttime heavens, we are now in to "Galaxy Season" the time of the year where we get better views of more distant objects beyond our Milky Way Galaxy. Two recent occurrences sparked the idea for this BN entry: the interest it caused by the posting of photos of galaxies that I had taken on to the Burton Facebook sight and a new series on the TV, "The 3 Body Problem." You may or may not have seen it – it raises some interesting questions. I thought we could consider for this article – "is there anyone out there?"

The photo below is of an area called 'M66 -The Leo Triplet'. It is one of many 'clusters' of galaxies each consisting of trillions of stars, and it is now firmly believed that the majority of these stars each have their own planetary systems. So, what are the chances of phoning a friend... or foe?

Back in 1961, a chap called Frank Drake came up with an equation now known as the Drake equation which calculated the probability that there might be another planet hosting intelligent life upon it just within our own Milky Way Galaxy.

N = the number of civilizations in the Milky Way galaxy with which communication might be possible

N = Number of stars in the Milky Way Galaxy

fp = the fraction of those stars that have planets.

ne = the average number of planets that can potentially support life per star that has planets.

fl = the fraction of planets that could support life that actually develop life at some point.


fi = the fraction of planets with life that go on to develop intelligent life (civilizations).

fc = the fraction of civilizations that develop a technology that releases detectable signs of their existence into space.

fL = fraction of a planetary lifetime graced by a technological civilization

Now, I can feel your eyes glazing over! Don't worry, we are not going to start performing a page of mathematics, in summary, the results were phenomenally wide ranging from virtually no chance at all to a reasonably good chance. All Frank Drake intended was to promote thoughtful discussion. It has been adapted over the years by people such as Pulitzer Prize-winning author, Carl Sagan, whose book 'Cosmos' inspired the ground-breaking series of the same name in the early 80s. Furthermore, the actual probabilities have been refined as the science has developed. For example, over the last 10 years we have started to realize there are a huge number of stars with planetary systems. If you want to delve further, there is much more on the internet in places like Wikipedia.

So where does this leave us? Well, I'm not expecting a little green man knocking on my door any time soon! The problem is one of both time and distance (huge amounts of both!) and the theoretical limit of being unable to travel faster than the speed of light.



The galaxy in the image is a reconstruction of the Milky Way, as if it were about 110,000 light-years in diameter (more recent research suggests it's even bigger than that).

The itsy-bitsy white dot is how far our radio signals have travelled from Earth since the first emission in 1897. In effect the light we are observing from the opposite side of our own galaxy set off as our early human ancestors started moving out of Africa into Europe.

Beyond this, our nearest major galaxy, Andromeda, lies over 2.5million light years away and those in the Leo triplet, seen earlier, are around 35million light years distant and these are our relatively close neighbours. The most distant confirmed galaxy is 'JADES -GS-z13-0,' discovered by the JWST in 2022 lies around 33.5 billion light years away and probably long before our galaxy existed let alone little Earth.

So, personally, I do not think it is very likely that we are about to have an interstellar let alone an intergalactic text, email or phone call any time soon. I can quite believe that it is probable other life exists beyond our own confines and there may well be intelligent civilizations which exist out there, but the practicalities of communication with our present levels of scientific knowledge make this very improbable.

As I am writing this, we have just had, as you probably know, the most amazing display of the Aurora Borealis. It was awesome to see so many of you out there posting your astrophotos on the Burton Westmorland Facebook page – they were amazing! As Fiona and I watched in Penzance (!) looking at the amazing spectacle in the early hours, we were giggling at the image of Burton residents having a mass pyjama party all staring at the night sky. Let's hope for a repeat showing as we move back towards the peak solar activity in the autumn months. Also in the autumn, there is another cosmic visitor heading our way in the form of comet (C/2023 A3 (Tsuchinshan–ATLAS)) and hopes are very high for this to be visible to the naked eye, so, fingers crossed for a good show and lots of clear skies.

June and July are months where we never reach true astronomical darkness, so what to look out for? Well, there will be some evenings when a new moon can make quite a spectacle and there is always the challenge of capturing the un-sunlit disc in the twilight. Also, if you are lucky enough to be heading to the Mediterranean, or further south where night falls earlier, then there are good opportunities to capture the milky way arching over head. If you can find an interesting landscape as well this can combine to make some stunning views. Have a lovely Summer!

It's a date in Burton & Clawthorpe! History notes by Kath Hayhurst

Thomas Pearson was born at Coat Green, in Dalton. He was baptised at Burton church on the 23rd May 1738. He had four sisters. He went to London circa.1756 and entered the Navy Office. He left England in 1761 as a cadet in the service of the East India Company, eventually becoming a Major. In 1767 he married Sarah Irwin and they had a daughter, but sadly his wife died a year later. Thomas returned to England in 1770 and soon after, he built Burton House with an extensive library.



His portrait was painted by George Romney about 1771, the picture hangs in Vancouver Art Gallery. Another of him with a Brahmin, is in Ohio. Major Pearson left for Calcutta again in 1776, and he died there in 1781. His only child Sarah, married Thomas Wogan Browne, of Castle Browne in Ireland. They were also painted by George Romney.

The crest of the Pearson family of Nether Hall, Gressingham is a parrot. This a sketch from a photograph of the bottom of the water spouts, at Burton House, if I remember correctly!



Vicar's Letter...

How can we help?

Dear Friends

Our church was built for the whole village, and I was appointed as a minister to everyone, not just those who gather on Sundays. Of course, anyone is welcome to come to our services, events and the groups we run for those enquiring about Christian faith (a warm welcome guaranteed) but here's five other things you may wish to know:

Visiting you

I am available to talk about anything that I might be able to help you with. If you've got questions, or you'd just like to talk, then do get in touch. We also have a small team who regularly visit those in any kind of need. If that's you, or someone you know, please ask.

Visiting the church

Churches should be places where anyone can find quiet to think or pray. Burton church is open 10am - 4pm every Friday and Saturday for anyone to visit and we're working to get Holme church open too. Watch for an announcement!

Baptisms (aka Christenings)

Baptism is a sign of the Lord Jesus' willingness to forgive and wash clean from all guilt. The 'candidate' is received into Christ's family and confirms that Christ is his or her Saviour and Lord. (For a child, parents and godparents answer for him or her.) I'd be delighted to meet you and discuss this.

Weddings

Church weddings openly acknowledge that marriage is God's gift and the vows are made before Him. If you are not previously married and have lived here at any time for at least 6 months (or you have another 'qualifying connection') then you can be married in the church. If you have been married before then a church wedding may be possible, but we need to talk. A Church of England wedding costs £712.

Funerals

Anyone who lived here, or had a connection to the parish, can have a church funeral service and burial in the churchyard. I also take services at the Crematorium for those who would like a Christian funeral service there. We inter ashes in the churchyard under a simple stone tablet. A funeral service in church, with burial, costs £719 (not including grave-digging or other charges paid to the funeral director).


