

Local History Society Visit to Dalton Hall

In May the Burton, Holme & District Local History Society were fortunate to be given a guided tour of Dalton Hall by Francis Mason-Hornby.

The Hall was originally a five bay Georgian house. In 1858 Italianate bays were added to the left and right hand side - as shown in the black & white photograph at right. The architects were Paley and Austin of Lancaster.



The present Hall was built on part of the site, for Mr and Mrs A.F. Mason-Hornby in 1973. The building was the last commission for Mr Clough Williams - Ellis Architect, (of Portmerion fame) in 1969. The estate was purchased by the Hornby family in the 19th century and remains in the family today.

The Local History Society members thanked Francis for a very informative visit.

It's a date in Burton & Clawthorpe! History notes by Kath Hayhurst

The Royal Oak - A History - Part One

In 1661 Burton became a Market Town by a Charter granted by King Charles II. When the Rev. Thomas Machell rode through Burton in 1692 he said 'There are some good Inns lately built'. Unfortunately he didn't name them.

The earliest reference to the Burton Royal Oak I can find is in 1757, when the first stage-coach came to the village; in place of pack horses. In a survey of 19,000 British Inn names, Royal Oak was the 7th most popular. The original tree was the one Charles II hid in, after the battle of Worcester.

The Royal Oak at Keswick was previously called The Oak, and Royal was added later, after Charles II's restoration to the throne. However, the Royal Oak at Cartmel is named after a battle ship which was built in 1667.

To be Sold in several Lots,

At the Royal Oak in Burton, in the County of Westmorland, on Wednesday the 28th. Day of October 1767, the Sale to begin at 7 o'Clock in the Evening: The Tithes Farms and parcels of Land hereinaster mentioned.

In 1763 the first stage-coach drawn by six horses came twice weekly to the Burton Royal Oak. It travelled at six miles per hour. 1767 saw a sale of various plots of land in Milnthorpe, Holme, and Preston Patrick, advertised as taking place at the Royal Oak - see above. By 1786 the Mail coach stopped there, because the first Post Office was part of the building.

In 1796 John Rigg was the landlord, and in 1798 he had a sale of coppice wood at the Inn.



Vicar's Letter...

On His Majesty's Service

Dear Friends,

On 4th July we have an opportunity to elect Members to the Parliament of the United Kingdom. Some of those who are elected will know that they should serve those who elected them. Some may talk more about wanting to serve the cause of justice. And some (secretly) may be hoping that their time as an MP will serve their own egos and personal ambitions. But ultimately, they all have a responsibility to the Lord Jesus Christ, even those who think they have no connection to him.

Why do I say that? 2000 years ago, the apostle Paul stood in the centre of Athens, surrounded by grand public buildings and temples to various gods, and declared that the God who created each Athenian had "set a day when he will judge the world with justice by the man he has appointed. He has given proof of this to all men by raising him from the dead" (Acts 17:31). Each citizen would need to give an account of his life to the risen Jesus. And rulers would certainly not escape this reckoning, quite the reverse, for Jesus had said, "From everyone who has been given much, much will be demanded." (Luke 12:48)

Very few of those who lived within the Roman Empire had any role in choosing who governed them; they couldn't vote to change their emperor! But Paul did urge them to pray "for kings and all those in authority, that we may live peaceful and quiet lives in all godliness and holiness." (1 Timothy 2:1-2)

Paul's prayer tells our MPs what they should do – they should aim that those who are godly and holy (by Jesus' standards) will be able to live peaceful and quiet lives. And they should aim for those who reject such goodness and purity to not have peace and quiet.

This prayer also reminds us how the Bible will shape us as voters – teaching us not to vote for those who just give us what we want in life, but to look for candidates who will make life peaceful for anyone who obeys God's laws. And not forgetting to keep praying "for kings and all those in authority".
