We are offering Free bike marking with “BikeRegister”. Bike register is the UK’s National Cycle Database with over 1 million bikes registered. It aims to reduce cycle theft across the country and enables owners to be reunited with their bikes if they are stolen and recovered. It is the only police-approved database and every police force in the UK uses BikeRegister to search for bikes they recover to see if they are reported stolen. PARISH COUNCIL NEWS

The Parish Council year started with the Parish Council elections on 2nd May 2024; as there were fewer candidates than places available no actual poll took place. We did go to the polls on 4th July 2024 for the General Election and whilst the result is widely understood it marked a major change for us because of the boundary change in 2024. We moved from the Westmorland and Lonsdale constituency situated entirely in Cumbria to Morecambe and Lunesdale which straddles both Lancashire and Cumbria. This cross-county boundary arrangement means that our MP must respond to residents who have dealings with separate district and county councils.

2024-25 has been a quieter year for the Parish Council with fewer consultation documents to consider possibly due to the changes from South Lakeland District Council to Westmorland & Furness Council. We are always trying to increase community engagement with the Parish Council and a selection of the issues that have been discussed this year at the suggestion of residents include:

- Live streaming of meetings
- Funding for Burton News
- Speed limit on Clawthorpe Lane
- Pedestrian access from Meadow Close to The Square
- Water supply issues with United Utilities
- Improvements to the children's playground
- Provision of electric vehicle chargepoints

I urge anyone who feels that they would like to try and make a difference to their community to consider putting themselves forward to join the Parish Council. We currently have vacancies, and we are keen to have some fresh faces with new ideas on the Parish Council. The Agenda and Minutes of all our meetings are published monthly and posted on the parish notice boards; they are also available online at www.burton-in-kendal-pc.gov.uk Please contact the Parish Clerk if you would like the Agenda and Minutes emailed to you on a regular basis.

Most small complaints made to the Parish Council are dealt with by the Clerk who chases up the relevant department of Westmorland & Furness Council by email or 'phone but general housekeeping duties are carried out by our hardworking Lengthsman David Holmes. I would like to thank my fellow parish councillors past and current for their commitment this year; they give generously of their own free time to serve the people of this Parish in various ways. All that remains is to thank Christine our Parish Clerk for all her hard work and guidance over the year and without whom none of what we decide would happen.

Westmorland and Furness council run our local libraries, for example the library in Kendal. As well as the usual services you would expect from our libraries, you might be interested to know about the online services you can receive as well.

If you have a library card you can register online and 'borrow' audiobooks, just like you would a paperback or hardback copy of a book from the physical library. What's more, the online library also includes access to all national newspaper's digital versions every day for free, plus a wide selection of magazines. This could potentially save residents a significant sum of money if you have a digital subscription to a newspaper, or pay to subscribe to a audiobook service.

To access this free resource download the 'Borrowbook' app on to your device. You will need to enter your library card number. If you do not currently have a library card you can apply online at the Kendal Library website, and enter your details. Happy reading!

Year 3 gave their fantastic dance performance at the Brewery Arts Centre in Kendal, they did brilliantly! As well as attending the Brewery, Year 3 have also been on a trip to Keswick museum as part of their project studying rocks.

We also hosted our new constituency MP, Lizzi Collinge, who had a tour of school and had a Q&A session with our Year 5 and 6 children. The children asked many fascinating questions, ranging from the reasons for becoming an MP, previously held jobs and her opinion of President Trump.

Other highlights include a PJ/Mufti Day and Bake sale, for Bay Search and Rescue, World Book Day, Red Nose Day and all children having the opportunity to visit the touring Library Bus to either select books to read in school, or share stories with the librarian.

Our thanks again go to Mr Burrows and the 'Open the Book' team, who have once again been regular welcome contributors to our Collective Worship time. Diana and Katy, from NISCU, also visited school to share a special Easter assembly. Diana is retiring after many years of visiting us and working for NISCU, we wish her all the very best for her retirement.

BURTON PICKLEBALL CLUB

Westmorland and Furness Council's reaction to the group's success.

Residents in the village of Burton-in-Kendal are crediting the up-and-coming sport of Pickleball with changing lives and improving their physical and mental health. Pickleball, a cross between tennis, table tennis and badminton, is amongst the fastest-growing sports in the UK.

The group in Burton-in-Kendal received a grant of £700 from Westmorland and Furness Council, made available via new software to make funds accessible to small groups, and used the money to buy Pickleball nets, paddles (the bats they play with) and balls. And now they're going from strength to strength.

Jeanie Christian, a regular player at Burton-in-Kendal Pickleball, said "although it was a small grant in lots of ways, it's gone far". There are now ten sessions of Pickleball a week at Burton Memorial Hall, with over 100 people attending the sessions, from young adults to those in their 70s. "This grant has changed the lives of some of our members, from people who have never played a sport, to those whose mental health has been significantly changed for the better. The group is not only a sport but a social group, and many friends have been made. This has changed the face of our village and beyond."

Stuart Waller is a regular Pickleball player now, but he had never done anything like this before hearing about the sessions in Burton. "Most of us are retired. And that's the beauty of it, that people that are retired can be active. It's exercise, it's fun, we laugh more than anything else. It's not a heavy sport. Other people do play it that way. Then there are competitions, leagues and things like that. But that doesn't interest me. I just like the fun of it."

Frances Fall is another regular, who fits Pickleball sessions around time playing tennis. "It's short and quick. You're on, off, on, off. It's good fun. It's on in the morning and our tennis is always in the afternoon. If it's raining and your tennis is off, then it's handy to come here."

The club has even managed to loan its equipment out to other nearby Pickleball groups who are starting up until they can secure funding to buy their own. Those clubs are now thriving too. Councillor Virginia Taylor, Westmorland and Furness Council's Cabinet member for Sustainable Communities and Localities, said "this grant is a great example of the council's Community Power strategy in action - communities know how they can best use small amounts of money for local projects to make a real difference for where they live."

FITNESS IS FUN!

This month let's get down to the nitty gritty----aerobic exercise which means raising your heart rate and perhaps getting a bit sweaty. Regardless of age, weight or ability this has many benefits and, done regularly, the body adapts and becomes stronger and fitter. If you enjoy going to the gym or running 3 times a week or playing sport, brilliant, you'll know what it's like to get the heart rate up. But....what if you don't like the gym; RUNNING!!! Goodness me, no and as for competitive sport....'I was always the last one to be picked at school'.etc. etc. All is not lost. There are loads of things to do. You take regular walks already....simply aim to walk that bit faster. Have fun finding a workout online. Remember Joe Wicks in lockdown? He's still as enthusiastic as ever with workouts to suit all ages and abilities.

Here is a simple way to get all the benefits of an aerobic session in just 5 minutes to work out the entire body. Newbies aim for 20 seconds of work, 40 seconds rest Intermediates 30 seconds on, 30 seconds rest Fit as fiddles 40 seconds on 20 seconds rest:

Jog on the spot

Jumping jacks

Mountain climbers

Press ups (can be done against a wall; with knees on the ground; full press up)

Squats

If you can't do one of the exercises for whatever reason , you can easily substitute another one in or just repeat one of the others. Potential benefits: increase stamina, fitness and strength; ward off viral illnesses by positively activating the immune system; reduce health risks; boost your mood to name just four. Useful hack....pop your sessions in your diary for a couple of weeks ahead so they become part of your regular routine. If you're not used to aerobic exercise, then do start slowly. All you're trying to do is raise your heart rate and that'll be obvious! A brisk walk or a dance to upbeat music would be a super start. Build up the time, pick up the pace as fitness improves.

Please enjoy whatever kind of aerobic exercise you choose and have fun! Remember kids and partners can join in for free! If you have a condition that limits this kind of exercise then please do seek advice before starting. And don't forget to congratulate yourself !

A Great Boon

Dear Friends,

On Saturday 17th May we are holding a 'Boon Day' at St James Church to which you are warmly invited. I had never heard of this term until we moved here 11 years ago. I knew that a 'boon' was something very helpful in life but not that 'boon day' meant a day of work without pay, including those days when neighbours got together to help each other out. Farmers told me that there was a tradition of helping each other with tasks that needed many hands – boon days would be held in turn on different farms and they would all go to help each other. Those were special days because working together is better than working alone.

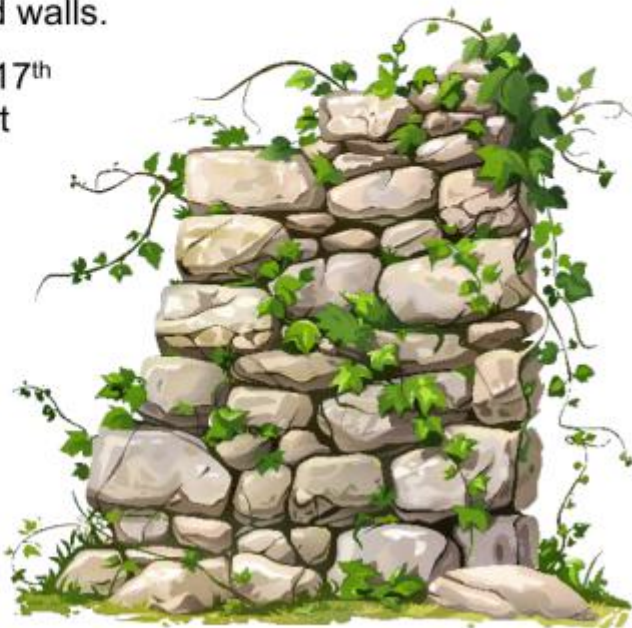
So our church boon days are an invitation to come and help look after the village church and, especially, the churchyard. We ask for help because we know that many value this historic and beautiful space in our village, and because the building and churchyard is available to the whole village, for worship and prayer, for weddings and funerals, and for the burial and remembrance of much-loved relatives.

In England each local church has to provide the funds and manpower to look after its own building and churchyard – that is why a fee is charged for every burial (whether full or of ashes) and for introducing memorial stones or for adding an inscription to an existing stone. Your payments help us to maintain the churchyard while the rest of the money comes from the gifts of our congregation members and sometimes from generous legacies. Mowers and their fuel and maintenance are expensive, as are the services of professionals like tree surgeons. We are very grateful to Tony Jolley who voluntarily looked after our churchyard grass for many years, and now to David Lewthwaite who has kindly taken on the task. It is a very large area to cut with all the added challenges of mowing around graves and walls.

Our Boon Day runs from 10am–1pm on 17th May. All help is welcome even for a short time. If you can bring gardening equipment that is helpful but we also have some available. It is an encouragement to those who usually maintain the building and grounds when a good number of us give a few hours to tackle the parts that they cannot reach. Be a boon!

HOLME AND DISTRICT LOCAL HISTORY SOCIETY V.E.+50 EXHIBITION

We would like to thank all the people who so generously loaned photos and war time items for our exhibition on Sat. 6th May. We gained a lot of information from visitors - unknown people were identified on old photos and many interesting stories told to us, about memories the pictures, etc., evoked.

We discovered a little about the 4 Burton men who died in the Second World War. The Memorial to them in the Church took the form of "A tribute made by the parishioners of an electric addition to the organ." The brass plaque is on the organ, and continues "1939-1945 To the Glory of God and in abiding memory of those who have given their lives in the Greater World War." Walter A. Smart, George H. Crayston, Robert N. Wilkinson, Thomas W. Varey.

Walter John Albert Smart has a memorial inscription in Burton graveyard. He was Sgt. Navigator, R.A.F. V.R., and was killed on active service April 26th 1942, aged 20 years. Interred at Harwell, Berks., W. Smart lived at School House, Church Bank, Burton, and attended Burton Morewood School, where his father was Headmaster. He went on to Heversham Grammar School. His sister, Ethel, gained her B.Sc.(Econ) degree in 1945.

George H. Crayston was in his 30's when he joined up. He had 5 brothers in the First World War, one of whom died. George was a gardener for Mr. and Mrs. Hoyle of Underfell and lived in the top cottage above Burton House, South Wing, with his wife Jenny and son George Grafton. He was a bell-ringer at Burton Church and played tennis on the village courts. He was in the Army - Royal Artillery - and was killed in a machine gun

nest in the desert at Tobruk, Libya. His widow and son live in Norwich.

Robert N. Wilkinson was born at Henridding Farm, Dalton - he went to Burton Morewood (Old) School and then to Heversham Grammar School. He was particularly good at languages and played rugby in the school team. He joined the Merchant Navy and made many trips to Iceland, West Africa and America. His ship was torpedoed while part of a convoy carrying a cargo of depth charges. He died aged 19 in Feb. 1943 and left his parents, a brother and a sister.

Thomas W. Varey of Clawthorpe Cottages also went to Burton Morewood (Old) School and the Lancaster Royal Grammar School. Before joining the R.A.F. he worked in the offices of Messrs. ~~James Wilkinson & Son Ltd.~~ Lancaster. He became a Sgt. Navigator and took part in many bombing raids over Germany and the continent. He was reported missing and almost a year passed before his parents at Clawthorpe were informed of his burial in France. He died in April 1944, aged 33. He left his parents, a brother, a sister and a brother-in-law also in the R.A.F.
