Reminiscing

Eighteen years ago, (almost to the day), having agreed the purchase of the Village Store, we visited Burton on the day of the Annual Carnival. Reminiscing, (as all retired folk must) back then the Carnival was an exciting affair with a procession of neighbourhood floats, a bouncy castle children's races and stalls laid out on the school playing field. In the evening there was a fancy dress competition judged by the "Carnival Queen & King", Barbara & Jack Winrow. As many of you know, Barbara was the longest serving staff member from two previous owners. Along with Jan, Veronica & Tracy and of course Tim & Elaine, they helped us on our way with our first retailing steps. Through the years we have been lucky to have highly competent & committed staff. We would not have been able to survive without them. Especially, we must mention the most recent team who were able to keep the shop & PO fun to visit & running efficiently. They will always be in our hearts & minds.

Back to the Carnival Day, we had the opportunity to meet members of the village, and we received the first warm welcomes of many that would follow. A few days later, we received the keys and so began our tenure as custodians of the Village Store & Post Office. It took us some years of "learning the ropes" but finally we started the major renovation project that had been in mind from the beginning. It was interesting how many customers enjoyed the small one room pop-up shop in the memorial hall. We thank the Hall Committee for their kind offer. Not very long after the renovation was complete, we were still "basking" in the glow of the new shop design, the pandemic raised its ugly head. That also brought to the surface the unyielding community spirit that typifies Burton, lots of volunteers taking food items to those isolating and helping any way they could. The village must be immensely proud of all these folk.

During the pandemic Akis became seriously ill and was hospitalised for months. That forced us to re-arrange the workings of the shop, always depending on the help & support of our staff. After tiring of life in Preston Royal Hospital he returned home for a prolonged period of recuperation. The understandable strain of all this brought to the surface Gill's orthopaedic problems that grew more severe, resulting in double hip operations a few years later. Slowly coming back to the shop (first Akis, then Gill) we were very touched with all the "Get Well" cards, chocolates & flowers from our customers.

Those medical issues for both of us, together with our advancing age, forced us to alter our pre-pandemic plans and start thinking about retirement. We are pleased that, on retirement, we can hand over to a younger family, Siyan and Thurka with their son Aadvik, and their staff. We know how difficult it is for village shops to survive in the highly competitive food market of today, but we feel sure that you will give them the support that they need to take things further. We would be remiss not to remember again all those that we have had the chance to know, start friendships with but also to lose for a number of reasons. Thank you for all the retirement cards, your wishes, gifts and flowers. We will see you around.

Fitness Is Fun!

Next in our fitness regime is strength training -using body weight to build up muscle mass, endurance and strength which can then support us as we carry out our day to day activities

Benefits of regular strength training can build lean muscle which burns more calories; it may reduce the risk of injury or falling and it may help to decrease blood pressure.

In short strength training may increase quality of life especially as you age.

To get the best results start slow and focus on **doing the exercises correctly**.

You don't need any special equipment...your own body weight and gravity will work wonders. AND you need very little space or time!

Here's a sequence of classic body weight exercises that will give all the major muscles a workout, but do please check on correct form before launching into lots of repetitions!

Squats. Especially for glutes, quads and hamstring. Keep your back straight and chest open, knees going in same direction as feet!



Reverse fly. Targets shoulders and upper back, but make sure the movement is very controlled ie lift rather than swing your arms up .



Lunges. Another for glutes, quads and hamstrings with hip flexibility and balance thrown in.

Press ups . For chest arms and core. Start with push ups against a wall or work top if you need to, then progress to the floor with knees bent [as illustrated] and finally to a full press up . Again, correct technique is important.



Glute bridges. Working glutes, hamstrings, lower back and core. Can stay in bridge, or lower and raise the hips.



Do each exercise for 30 seconds if you can, without a rest in between exercises and repeat the whole sequence twice....a grand total of 5 minutes.

Combining weight training with cardio is great for brain health too....what's not to love.

Burton C were Runners-up in Division 2, just 4 points behind a young and talented Natland E team and their awards were collected by John Fitzgerald, who also collected the first ever 'Top of the Averages' trophy for Division 2, having won 36 of his 39 singles matches, at a win % of 92.3%.

Division 2 of the Spring Junior League completed at Natland on April 22nd. Burton TTC had 2 teams in this division and Burton Beavers, represented by Louis Gwillim and Zach Martin, finished 2nd in this 8-team division and left with the silver medals. Burton Bears, who rotated between 3 players, Hugo Robinson, Toby Craig and Eben Johnson, finished 6th. Louis also collected the 'Best Player' award, having finished top of the averages, having won 19 of his 20 singles matches at a win rate of 95%!

The Thursday evening adult social sessions have now paused for the summer break and will resume on Thursday, September 11 th @ 6.00. Similarly, the Thursday early evening Junior Coaching sessions will break for the summer following the final session on Thursday, May 22nd.

During the 2024/25 season, 17 players have represented the Club in the KDTTL Senior League, 15 people have attended the Adult Social sessions, and 9 children have attended Junior Coaching. Thanks are due to Martin Wakelin for leading the Junior Coaching sessions.

Table tennis will resume at the Burton Table Tennis Club at the beginning of September, starting with match practice for Senior League players on Wednesday, September 3rd @ 7.00. Have a great summer!



At the Top

Dear Friends,

What would you say is most needed for a country, or a family, to thrive? Hard work and enterprise? Law and order? Compassion and kindness?



These are all good in their proper place but we're wrong to assume that we human beings can fix our problems on our own, without reference to the God who designed us and runs our world. That would be like assuming that any problems with our car can be fixed from the driving seat without lifting the bonnet. The problem, and the answer, goes deeper.

First, **Grace**. In the Bible this means not 'graceful' but rather the undeserved kindness of God. He gives or withholds (as he chooses) – rain, crops, business success, family happiness, good government, military strength, health, sanity, and life itself. Since every breath we take is a gift from God it follows that no person, family or nation can survive or thrive without our Creator's gracious giving. No man has ever given to Him but every man receives all he has from Him.

And second, **Faith**, which is not the ability to believe in unfounded myths but simply means 'trust'. Faith is the conviction that God is trustworthy and so we can rely on every word of his Word, the Bible. We like to think that we live in a scientific age where we have personally proved all facts but in reality nearly everything we know comes from the testimony of those who we trust.

Faith is the natural partner to grace. God gives; faith is the holding out of our hands to receive. Faith takes us from grumbling to gratitude, from self-justification to confession of our faults, from self-sufficiency to dependence on God's provision, from pride to humility, from disobedience to obedience, from worry to trust.

Even if you've never done this before why not ask God to give what you need, and to give you the open hands of faith to receive his gift? Ask for yourself, for your family, for our nation. Jesus tells us that God his Father loves to give good gifts like the best of fathers. (Matthew 7:7-11)

Why become a Parish Councillor?

If you've never been to a parish council meeting before, you may be forgiven for thinking that parish councillors are a group of people who meet now and then in a draughty village hall. If, however, you live in a community where something 'big' has happened, you'll know that when people in the community need support and guidance, it is sometimes the parish council that is turned to.

By becoming a parish councillor you become someone your community will look to for help, guidance and support a community leader with the power to influence decisions for the benefit of the people you serve. Seeing your community change for the better, as a result of decisions you have helped make, is something that can give you a sense of achievement and pride.

How much time does it take up?

Councils usually meet once a month for the council meeting, to which members of the public are also invited. Meetings may last two or three hours, depending on the agenda set for the meeting to discuss. There are some committees to deal with specific subjects, such as budget and finance issues. In addition to the regular meetings, councillors are required to attend other meetings representing the council, for example acting as a representative on an outside body, community activities or helping develop a new project for the community. Such meetings won't happen every day, so it's not going to take over your life.

How long does a parish councillor serve for?

Once elected, parish councillors sit on the council for a maximum of four years. If they then want to stay in the post they can stand for re-election. Many of Burton-in-Kendal Parish Councillors have served for almost 20 years. Applicants should note that Councillors are expected to attend regular meetings and any additional meetings as may be arranged, and to represent the electors of Burton-in-Kendal in raising and discussing those issues of interest and concern on which the Parish Council is empowered to act.

Am I eligible to be a Parish Councillor?

You have to be:

- a British subject, or a citizen of the Commonwealth or the European Union
- over 18 years of age

Additionally you have to be one of the following:

- a local government elector for the council area for which you want to stand
- have during the whole of the 12 months occupied as owner or tenant any land or other premises in the council area or within 3 miles of it for the whole period
- have during that same period had your principal or only place of work in the council area or within 3 miles of it for the whole period.

You cannot stand for election if you:

- are subject of a bankruptcy restriction order or interim order.
- have, within five years before the day of the election, been convicted in the United Kingdom of any offence and have had a sentence of imprisonment (whether suspended or not) for a period of over three months without the option of a fine.
- you work for the council you want to become a councillor for (but you can work for other local authorities, including the principal authorities that represent the same area).

You don't have to be connected to a political party.

If you do become a parish councillor you will have to sign up to the Code of Conduct.

Don't take our word for it! The best way to find out what it's like to be a parish councillor is to talk to someone who's doing it now.

Come along to a parish council meeting, or speak to one of our councillors and find out what they think of the job.
