
The annual Christmas lunch will be at 'The Smithy' on Tuesday December 2nd , 12:00 for 12:30.

PARISH COUNCIL COMMUNITY BRIEFING

What's Being Proposed

Lowering the speed limit from 30mph to 20mph on an **A-road that also acts as a motorway relief road**

Why It's Difficult

- **A-roads are main routes** designed to carry lots of traffic quickly and reliably.
- Government guidance says **20mph is usually not suitable for A-roads** unless there is a very strong reason
- Police and enforcement teams must agree to help enforce the lower limit, otherwise drivers may ignore it.

When 20mph Can Happen

A lower limit can be approved if:

- There is **clear evidence of accidents or danger**, especially for pedestrians and cyclists.
- The road passes through a **community area** (schools, shops, housing).
- **Average speeds are already low** (close to 20-24mph)
- Extra measures like **speed bumps, crossing, cameras, or narrowing** are added to slow traffic.

The Steps Involved

1. **Gather evidence** - accident records, traffic speeds, pedestrian use.
2. **Check against government rules** - is the road more community focused than traffic focused.
3. **Consultation** - local people, police, schools, businesses, emergency services.
4. **Legal order** - the local council must make a Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) to change the limit.
5. **Implementation** - signs, calming or cameras put in place.
6. **Monitoring** - check if speeds drop, safety improves, and the community benefits.

What This Means for Residents

- It's possible to get 20mph, **but much harder on a main A-road** than on smaller streets.
- The case must show that **safety and community needs are more important than traffic flow**
- Local support is vital: the stronger the backing from residents, schools, and councillors, the more likely the case will succeed.

Bottom Line

A 20mph limit on a major A-road will only be allowed if:

- **Safety evidence is strong**
- The road clearly serves a **community function**.
- Drivers can be persuaded (or forced) to slow down.
- The change does not seriously harm the road's role in moving traffic.

PARISH COUNCIL SKETCH

Once again residents turned up to the Parish Council meeting to express their concerns about traffic in the village during the Open Forum. Residents wanted to know where the Council currently stand in their approach to dealing with this issue. Councillors stated that the Community Briefing published in last month's Burton News (and republished here on the previous page) gives a summary of what has happened so far, and steps involved in the future.

Unfortunately the District Council have currently paused their application tool for residents to apply for a 20mph zone in the village. They have been overwhelmed by applications across the authority and do not have the funds to process any further applications at present. It is anticipated that this process will reopen in the future, and therefore if we wish to proceed with an application it is worthwhile getting organised and prepared for this so that we do not miss out on the next round of applications.

At this point it is worth reiterating that the application process must be undertaken by residents, with the support of the Parish Council. The application will only be successful if considerable public support for the application can be shown. It is therefore paramount that if residents actually want to see change then they will need to get involved.

In other matters, two planning applications were discussed, one for a single storey extension to a property on St James' Drive, and another for quite substantial alterations and repairs to Hordley House on Main Street. No objections have been received by the Parish Council.

The Council's Emergency Plan has been reviewed and updated and will be published on their website in due course. Indeed everyone at Burton News Towers are excited by the confirmation that the Parish Council will soon have a brand new website. We can't wait to see the exciting new design and functionality of this new site, and sit with barely contained excitement about the hours we can spend on the biggest online event of the year. If the internet breaks, you know who is to blame.

Finally a discussion was held around the state of the playground. There are some funds available to make improvements here, but the council would like people to join the Playground Working Group to look at suggestions, and decide on the best way forward. However, concerns were raised about the condition of some of the equipment, and whether or not there is sufficient money to make all the repairs and replacement of equipment necessary to make it fit for purpose again.

As ever, if there is an issue that you want to bring to the attention, you are more than welcome to attend any meeting, and raise your concerns in the Open Forum. Many of you have attended this year, and the Parish Council welcome the opportunity to address your concerns personally. They don't even make you sit through the rest of the meeting! The next meeting is Thursday 20th Nov.

Strength that Sacrifices

Dear Friends

What are men for? The answer given by Rob Munro, our bishop, while on an October visit to our congregations, was that men are to be "strength that sacrifices". That is, we are to be strong in every way (not just physically) so that we can stand against all that is evil. And when there is a price to pay, and suffering that can't be dodged, we are to be ready to step into the line of fire to protect those we love. How did the bishop know that is our calling? "Because," he said, "that's what Jesus did."

Those who were eyewitnesses of Jesus' life and work tell us that he always chose to serve and not to be served, that he rebuked his disciples for worrying about their own needs instead of serving others, and that he courageously stood up to the powerful Jerusalem leaders who were exploiting widows. And, knowing that his execution was the sacrifice that was needed to save others from their sin, Jesus told the mob that came for him in the middle of the night to let his friends go free and to get on with arresting him. "Greater love has no-one than this, that he lay down his life for his friends." (Jesus in John 15:13)

Of course both fathers *and* mothers should sacrifice for their children, and self-sacrifice is essential to *all* love. But a healthy nation will be one that is not ashamed to especially encourage its young men to be strong, strong in the fight against all that is evil, and strong in their willingness to shoulder the responsibility to sacrifice themselves for others. "Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her ..." (the apostle Paul in Ephesians 5)

On Remembrance Sunday we will remember with sadness and gratitude the years in our history when the ultimate sacrifice was required of so many hundreds of thousands. Churchill thought that this selfless courage had turned dark days into "great days — the greatest days our country has ever lived".

At the going down of the sun and in the morning, We will remember them.

IT'S A DATE IN BURTON - KATH HAYHURST

15th. March 1834

An extract from the Lancaster Gazette. The Ploughing Match.

On the the 6th of March, the annual ploughing match took place in a field in the occupation of Robert Briggs of (the Green Dragon) Burton, Westmorland. There were 12 competitors, 9 men and 3 boys, who each had half an acre allotted to them. Five hours were allowed for the work.

The prizes were awarded as follows,

To William Pool, ploughman to Mr. C. Garnett of Low Sizergh - the President's Silver Medal.

To William Seed, ploughman to Jas, Seed of Caponwray £2.

To John Townson, ploughman to Wm. Townson of Borwick. £1.

To George Cumming, ploughman to Thos. Cumming of Larkrigg. 15 shillings.

To Wm. Brown ,ploughman to Wm. Carter of Kellet. 10 shillings.

Premiums for boys,

To James Pool, son of William Pool of Seal Ford, (Hutton Roof). 15s.

To Thos Garnett, with Jas.Rookes of Deerslet, (Dalton.) 10s.

The Judges declared that the ploughing was executed in excellent style. The day was fine, and the attendance of gentlemen and farmers numerous, who raised a very handsome subscription for the unsuccessful candidates of 8 shillings each.
