



OPEN THE BOOK

Open the Book was started 7 years ago by Brian Whalley and a team of people from Burton and Holme Churches. The handbook says “Open the Book is an exciting storytelling project where Bible stories are shared with children in a way that is fun, interactive and memorable.” That is what we aim to do when we are in school on a Wednesday morning.

Those of you who have children at Burton Morewood School are probably too familiar with the Open the Book song that we start every assembly with. It is a very catchy little song and the children love to sing it. In fact, they often come into the hall singing it. After the song Brian introduces the story. Open the Book is a scripted programme and all Storytellers must stick to the script. We have a narrator for the story and others in the team act out the parts in the story. We try to involve the children as much as possible. They are always keen to take part. Sometimes we need soldiers. Recently we needed children to be David’s brothers.

We are so lucky to have the big screen in the school hall. Brian uses it for amazing back drops that help the stories to come alive. After the story we have a

quiet moment for reflection and end with a prayer. Then we sing another song, usually related to the story, always lively with lots of actions and very loud.

All the members of the Open the Book team are DBS checked. They have completed training and are registered with Open the Book.

"Maybe I should learn to love skydiving" she mutters defeated. This would be the time to jump, I think.


Two weeks later.....

Burton-in-Kendal Table Tennis Club

Dogfight at the top of Division 1

With 10 of the 18 matches now played, Burton A are currently top of Division 1 of the Kendal & District Table Tennis League (KDTTL), a single point ahead of arch-rivals Natland A. The head-to-head match between these two high quality teams was a monumental battle and despite Burton A's Gary Deakin inflicting a first defeat of the season on Natland's top player and last year's player of the season, James Neal, the match was edged 20-19 by Natland A.

Burton B are currently sitting 5th in this 10-team division but have a game in hand on the team immediately above. In Division 2, Burton C are still unbeaten and remain 34 points clear of nearest rival, Kirkby Stephen A, and with a game in hand. Graeme Wheelhouse is one of only 2 unbeaten players in the Division.

Since my last update, Burton D have climbed to 5th in this 8-team division. Burton C made it to the final of this season's first knock out cup competition, the Divisional Shield, but were narrowly beaten by a Kirkby Stephen A team featuring the Division's best player, Paul Smith.

Adult social table tennis continues in the Burton Memorial Hall on Thursdays from 6.00 to 7.00 pm. The cost is £3. Anyone wanting more information should contact Tony March by phone/ text or WhatsApp on 07814 029471 to make sure it's on, or email tony@lonsdaleconsulting.co.uk. All ages and standards welcome, including beginners. Coaching is provided for those that want it. The important thing is to come and have fun!

Junior coaching is also on Thursdays, from 5.00 until 6.00 pm, cost £2.50. Anyone aged 7 or above is welcome to attend, including beginners and the first session for new players is free. All table tennis takes place in the Burton Memorial Hall.

The first round of this year's Kendal & District Junior League has now been completed. Burton Badgers finished 4th in Division 1. Zach Martin and Hugo Robinson competed extremely well against opponents who were often older and bigger and will have learned a lot from the experience. Burton Bears, featuring Toby Craig and Eben Johnson, finished joint top of Division 2 Red. Both players won 7 of their 10 singles matches and only missed out on promotion to Division 1 due to an inferior head-to-head record against Milnthorpe Devils. The second round starts shortly.

The club was recently the very grateful recipient of a small legacy from the estate of the late Bill Willink, who lived in Dalton House for many years. Everyone associated with the club would like to express their appreciation for this very kind gesture.



IT'S A DATE IN BURTON - KATH HAYHURST

From the Lancaster Gazette June 11th 1836.

Fire in the Parish of Burton-in- Kendal.

On Thursday last at Coat Green farm, the property of W.W. Atkinson, Esq. a cottage house was burnt down and destroyed. Opinions respecting the accident are many, but, it is generally supposed that the chimney had been on fire some time before it broke out in the roof and other parts of the house.



PARISH COUNCIL SKETCH

This is a double bumper edition of the sketch, as it covers both the December and January meetings of the Parish Council. Things continue to move apace (snail's pace is still a pace right?) at the Council. The highlight of the December meeting was the kindly offer of a mince pie and glass of port which was warmly welcomed by your editor, although it goes without saying that bribes cannot sway our reporting of council matters.

The January meeting was a little busier, but largely driven by contributions from members of the public. The Open Forum is one of the most important aspects of the Council's monthly meeting, providing an opportunity for residents to raise issues and concerns, and in the case of this month's meeting, once again showing evidence of residents taking control of issues themselves.

Firstly, a representative of the Playground Working Group attended to discuss the progress they have made to extensively refurbish the playground. This has the potential to be a great asset to the village. The working group asked if they could apply for grant funding under the umbrella of the Parish Council, in the hope that this would speed up their application processes. They have to raise a considerable sum of money and are concentrating their energies at present on applying for grant funding and seed funding, and have requested that the Parish Council discuss what help they can offer at their next meeting.

Next up a representative from the Traffic Action group attended to ask if the Parish Council had made any progress with some of the issues that they are dealing with. They were no updates to report, in particular the council are still waiting for a response from Cumbria Police in regards to the Freedom of Information request that was submitted last year.

The Parish Council later went on discuss their budget for next year. This is in line with the precept received from Westmorland and Furness Council and therefore will have no impact on our Council Tax bills, although of course WFDC might still decide to raise this tax to cover their increasing costs.

There is still a vacancy on the Parish Council. If you are interested in becoming a councillor please get in touch with them directly, or go along to their next meeting to get a perspective on what is involved. The next meeting will be held on Thursday 19th February at 7.30pm in BMH.
