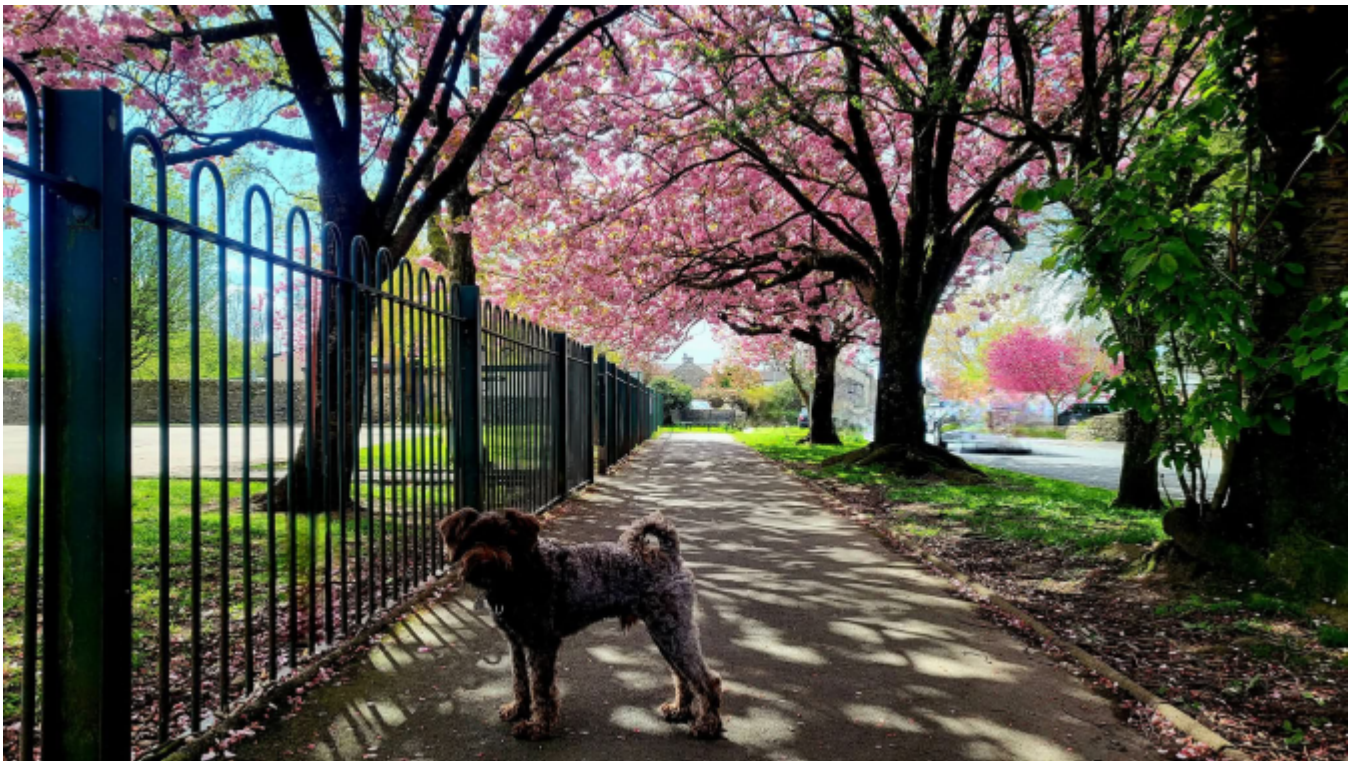

BROKEN CHORDS

Few musical performances come with a box of tissues and trigger warnings, but both were on offer at the premier of Broken Chords in BMH last night. Kirstie Pelling and Stuart Wickes, who lost their son, Matthew, to suicide in 2022, took us on their heart wrenching journey from the ominous knock on the front door, through the messy, chaotic and lonely rollercoaster of every moment after. Both talented musicians, writing songs became their way to make peace with grief and they have courageously decided to share that personal story, through their music. Kirstie channels her emotion through poetry, giving voice to feelings otherwise impossible to express, while Stuart finds meaning in the quiet, haunting, honesty of “Broken Chords” and his search for notes that simply felt right. Inspired by conversations, shared memories and the exploration of each other’s grieving, the songs shift beautifully between solo reflection, heartfelt duets, and moments when spoken word blends seamlessly with song. This all sounds difficult, and it is, but there are many lighter, even funny, moments along the way and Kirstie and Stuart succeeded in creating an intimate atmosphere which enveloped the audience in their living room. We learnt that you can’t just tick off stages of grief but must face them in disorganised waves, that well meaning people can say some truly crass things and that life sometimes sends you a curveball. Shining from the performance is the love that Kirsty and Stuart have for each other and how this helped them survive – only they could tell this story.

Tickets will help fundraising for the Cumbria charity “Every Life Matters” which offers specific bereavement support to those affected by suicide but also raises awareness to prevent it from happening. To encourage people to “reach out”; instead of a curtain call, we were invited to stay, talk and connect after the performance.

If you missed the show in Burton, there are further performances in May and June in various local community centres. For further details see www.ticketsource.co.uk/brokenchords. This is a piece which will stay with you long after the final note – go and see it if you have the chance. F. Thexton

The courts were awash with every shade of purple, from elegant lavender to outfits visible from space. Some kept it tasteful; others clearly took “dress in purple” as a personal challenge. And finally, right back at the beginning of this madness in February, was me, Annette, part-running and part-crawling for 50 miles. ART AND CRAFT SOCIETY

We are busy preparing for our Annual Art and Craft Exhibition to be held on 9 & 10 May in Burton Memorial Hall (poster elsewhere in this edition). Just in case you're not aware of our history, our Society began in 2005 after some Art Classes took place in the village led by Jill Chaldecott in 2004, and our first annual exhibition was held in Burton Memorial Hall in June 2005. So, as you can imagine, a lot of work has gone into the Exhibition over the years and this year is no exception. As with all events in our lovely village, it wouldn't happen without a lot of work, enthusiasm and dedication behind the scenes. As a relative newcomer to the village I am astounded with the variety of activities and clubs we have and the work of the dedicated people behind each one.

Our 'featured artist' this year is Catherine MacDiarmid catherinemacdiarmid.co.uk We are pleased and honoured that she has agreed to Open this year's exhibition and exhibit her work. Catherine has twice been selected for the prestigious BP Portrait Award, 2001 and 2002, and her work is included in the first 500 Portraits, a book by the National Portrait Gallery, 2011. Catherine has won various awards including the Pegasus Art Prize in Artist and Illustrators Artist of the Year 2017, the Alec Morrison Watercolour Award 2020 and second prize in the Royal Birmingham Society of Artists in 2016, and first prize in the Brewery Open 2002, amongst others. Catherine was elected a Member of the prestigious Lakes Artist Society in 2014, and the Contemporary British Portrait Painters in 2018. She is also a Founder Member of Green Door Artists in Kendal and South Lakes.

Catherine appeared in Sky Portrait Artist of the Year in 2014, 2018, and 2019 painting Ashley Jenson, Ross Kemp, Georgina Campbell and Courtney Pine, reaching the Semi Finals in 2019.

We are also looking forward to the display by our local Primary School. A regular feature in our event, the children exhibit their own artwork.

We are adding a new 'demonstration' area this year. Members of the Society and local artisans can also be seen working on their own projects and demonstrating their skills in real time.

IT'S A DATE IN BURTON - KATH HAYHURST

19th January 1839 - From the Lancaster Gazette

To be sold by auction at the house of Mr. William Bagot, know by the name of The Sun Inn in Lancaster, on Thursday the 24th day of January 1839 at 7 o'clock in the evening - All those FOUR capital messauges or dwelling houses, situate standing being on the west side of the Market Place in Burton-in-Kendal, together with two coach-houses, barns, stabling for 23 horses, with haylofts above the whole; three gardens, orchards and two crofts immediately behind the same, containing tohether 2A 1R 21P of land and now in the possession of Mrs. Crossley, Mr. Wilson, Mr. Roger Dickinson, Mr. John Hunter and others as Tenants.

The premisesoccupied by Mrs. Crossley contain a large entrance hall, drawing and dining room, six bedrooms, a kitchen, store room and cellars underneath. Those occupied by Mr. Wilson contain an entrance hall, a drawing room and parlour, three bedrooms, two large garrets and a very commodious kirchen, with cellars underneath. Also a good pew in Burton Church. The respective tenants will shew the premises and, for further particulars, application may be made to Mr. R. Gibson of Bolton-le-Sands, the owner, or at the office of Mr. Robert Jackson, solicitor, Lancaster.

Red Squirrels

Are often celebrated for their role as silent architects of the forest, as they inadvertently plant future woodlands by burying seeds they never retrieve. As native species, they are vital facilitators of healthy woodland maturation and are often used as symbols of conservation efforts to protect local biodiversity.

Facts List:

Red Squirrels have been around since pre historic times (Before Humans) They grow distinctive ear tufts in winter which they shed in spring (greys don't have them) the ear tufts are to keep them warm nothing to do with hearing. Their angles can rotate 180 degrees, so they can run down trees headfirst and not fall.

Squirrels are rodents the French call them Rat des arbres - Tree Rats. They have two litters of babies yearly 3 or 4 in a litter babies are called kittens. Mating involves high-energy mating chases; where multiple males pursue a fertile female through trees and across the ground. The female, fertile for only one day, mates with the most dominant/heaviest male in a brief, 'often vertical, encounter on a tree. Kits are born blind, deaf, and hairless, relying completely on their mother for 8–10 weeks.

PARISH COUNCIL SKETCH

It was a relatively quiet month at the Parish Council meeting. One interesting discussion was around the process of planning applications, and how residents can discuss and respond to them. Two residents did attend the Open Forum to raise some points in relation to a planning application at Thornleigh Drive. An application has been received to ask permission for front and rear 1st floor extensions to a property on the drive. Although the Parish Council do not have any power to stop any development like this, they can put through recommendations to the District Council.

If residents would like to have their opinion heard about any planning application, they can respond directly to the District Council, but can also inform the Parish Council so that they can take this on board when drafting their recommendations. This can be done in person at the Open Forum, or residents can write to the Parish Council. If you want to write to the Parish Council, you must include your name and address, but you can ask for these to be kept confidential in any public discussions about the application.

Elsewhere in the meeting, the issue of the Community Asset Register was raised. At present the PC note that the register lists the MUGA, playground, and Memorial Hall. Other properties can be added to the list if they meet the criteria. Any property on the register would therefore have to be offered to sale to the community if it was to be sold or redeveloped for another purpose. So hypothetically, if the King's Arms for example, was to be added to the register, it would have to be offered for sale to the community first before the current owners could choose to redevelop the building for another purpose. I would like to make clear that this is only a hypothetical situation, and there are currently no plans for this to happen.

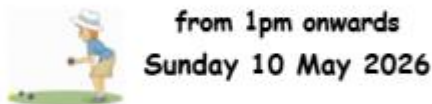

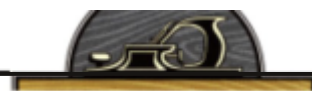
