Our mid-monthly coffee morning was another busy one, and again thanks to everyone who comes along and supports them, it's always a lovely friendly atmosphere. The August one raised another £95 for Hall funds, all of which helps us keep the Hall running.

Our September events for your diary are as follows:

Burton Book Drop & Coffee Mornings

Monday 7th September



Burton Book Drop Coffee morning is held in BMH on the first Monday in every month (unless its a bank holiday) from 10:00 to 11:00. All proceeds go to help the upkeep of the Hall. This is an opportunity to come and have a coffee, cake and a chat, buy a second hand book and use our Book Drop. The Book Drop is a community library service provided by Westmorland & Furness Council but manned by village volunteers.

PARISH COUNCIL SKETCH

The first important talking point of the night took place during the Open Forum. The first resident to speak asked about the traffic accident in the village in July and whether it had been minuted or logged by the Parish Council. The Council stated that the police will log incidents and that it isn't the job of the PC to log them. Cllr Wren mentioned that this accident was not speed related. The member of the public queried whether the PC is acting with due diligence in the regards to the safety of the residents. Chairperson Hornby also said that they do not log people who trip over. He also stated that they have not had an official report from the police, so it cannot be formally discussed by the PC. They cannot discuss an issue that is only hearsay, rather than based on specific evidence. The discussion then moved on to the campaign to reduce speed in the village to 20mph. Chairperson Hornby said that the PC have asked Westmorland and Furness Council but it is not in the current budget. Our request has been submitted and we are hoping to be in the running when the next round of applications are open again, however it will be at least 2027 before the next round opens and then there will be quite a lengthy consultation period. The PC wanted to reassure residents that they do take the issue seriously, have debated the issue over many years and do support residents desire to have a 20mph zone in the village.

In other news an amendment has been made to the planning application for the dog walking field in Clawthorpe. We will bring you news as soon as we have it about it's application. There was no report from our district councillor this month as she was absent. In reply to a resident's concern that a squeaky swing on the playground has been causing a noise nuisance to the local residents the PC are delighted to say that the swing has now been greased, and that they have saved at least one resident from being driven mad. You ask, the council delivers!

Discussion then moved on to the 40 (39?) Oak trees on Tarn Lane. These trees were planted by Burton Residents in the early 90s to commemorate Queen Elizabeth II 40th Jubilee, but unfortunately were planted quite close together. One has already died and the lower half of the trees heading towards the services may need taking out. It is not PC land, it will technically belong to the highway dept. If the trees are not thinned then there is a risk that all of them will be lost. The PC will suggest to the highways dept that something needs doing, and will wait to see what their response is.

Furthermore an exploratory discussion was held in regards to defibrilators in the village. Initially there was one on the village hall paid for by the Onion Show organisers. They usually have a lifespan of 7 years. First responders all carry defibs as well. It needs power source, cupboard to store and defib itself. They need to be checked weekly and maintained with new pads and batteries. There are others in the village, but the PC will hold further discussions as to whether or not there are sufficient in the village, and if not, where any future ones should be located, and how they should be funded. The Bowling Green was suggested as a possible new location for obvious reasons.

As you are probably aware, WFC introduced a fee for emptying our green bins back in April of this year. Cllr Wren suggested bypassing the £60 green bin scheme, arguing that we could set up a whatsapp or FB group to help people to bin share. Chairperson Hornby pointed out that this is not a PC issue but there is nothing to stop residents sorting this out themselves.

Finally, but very importantly, there was a report by The Lengthsman. He is responsible for a number of maintenance jobs around the villgae but has said that he is not going to do any more strimming on Caterpillar Walk until the issue of dog mess is sorted out. There is so much on the ground, that it is causing him a health concern. He will maintain the hedges but not trim the grass until residents start to take more care over their dog mess. BN fully endorses this stance. Please pick up your dog's mess, don't be selfish.

The rain is beating down on the village hall as Chief Leader Sayers pulls up in that battered old Fiat of hers, the engine coughing one last time before dying. It's a beautiful display of solidarity, but to a trained mind, something just doesn't add up. What's the motive here? Is it an inside job?

IT'S A DATE IN BURTON - KATH HAYHURST

Extract from the book 'Land of Promise'

At the time of their marriage John was farming in the vicinity of the village of Warton, Lancashire. Their first child, Ann, was born here, although by 1830 they had moved about one and a half miles to Yealand (Conyers) where John became a merchant and their second child, Mary, arrived. Not long afterwards, in 1832, they moved again, this time to Burton-in-Kendal, where John became proprietor of the Cross Keys Inn. If he rather than his father was the owner of the land put up for sale in Beetham, it's conceivable that he bought the hotel with the profits from that transaction. A year later he became owner of the more substantial Royal Oak Hotel, later known simply as the Royal Hotel. Choosing an establishment in Burton-in-Kendal was probably a modestly shrewd business decision. Located midway between Lancaster and Kendal it was a regular stopping and horse changeover place for commercial and privately owned coaches. It is an indication of John's financial shrewdness in farming and trade that a comparatively young man, from a modest social background, was able to purchase such a substantial business.

FAMILY HISTORY ENQUIRY

I am working on a family history project and have discovered that one branch of my family came from the Burton area. I have identified ancestors who lived there from at least 1700 to 1830 or so, and perhaps earlier and later than those dates. The family name is Hacking. In addition to Hacking, the other main family name, which is Clark. In the 1820s and 1830s, two young men, James Hacking and James Clark, were very good friends. James Hacking was born in Burton in 1802, and James Clark was born in nearby Clawthorpe (I believe it was Clawthorpe. There is a bit of a question in relation to his birthplace) in 1806. They became acquainted with two young ladies, sisters Jane and Elizabeth Pearson from Whitehaven. I do not know how or where they met. But, the sisters' mother, Alice Saul, was also born in Burton. Their father, John Pearson, was born in Whitehaven. So, even though the Pearson sisters were born in Whitehaven, their family has a tie to Burton. Eventually, James Hacking married Jane Pearson in Burton on 27 January, 1827, and James Clark married Elizabeth Pearson in Burton on 26 December 1829. The two new families eventually found themselves in Preston in the early 1830s, the date being established by the birth locations of their children, the older ones having been born in Burton and the younger ones in Preston, the Preston births starting about 1833. (Birth places and dates reveal a lot of information.) James Hacking became a carpenter and woodworker, and James Clark became a stonemason. In Preston, the two frequently worked together on building projects. Then, James Hacking died in 1839, and his widow, her children, and the Clark family immigrated to the United States. A son of James and Jane Hacking, John Sampson Hacking, and a daughter of James and Elizabeth Clark, Jane Clark, married in St. Louis Missouri, in 1856, even though they were first cousins (their mothers were sisters), and became my second great grandparents. But, for generations before their move to Preston, the family lived in and around the Burton area. I am trying to learn more about their lives while in Burton, if possible. One thing I do not know and am trying to discover is their reasons for moving from Burton to Preston, whether it was economic or something else. That is why I want to learn about the estates at the time and whether the Clark and Hacking families worked as tenant farmers for an estate or something like that. Any information that will help me to learn more about them, my third great grandparents, and preceding generations, will be valuable.

I found a reference to Sir George Middleton and Leighton Hall in the mid-1600s. It listed Burton among his lands and possessions. Perhaps references to this estate might be useful. I wonder if the current owners of Leighton Hall might have historical information on the estate during the 1600s through the 1800s and those who worked for them.

The more I learn about Burton and that region, the greater are the feelings I have that I am coming home in a way.

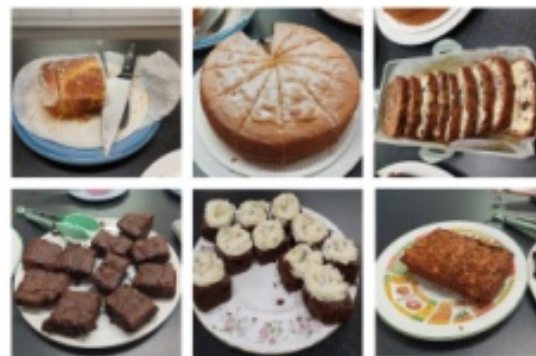

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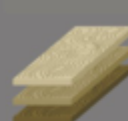
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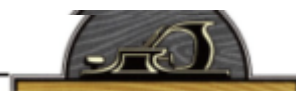
